Core Values



Equity: The resources we provide improve reading fluency by using an evidence-informed approach. We are passionate about making all children readers as a form of social justice. With literacy, comes academic success, informed decision-making, improved self-esteem, personal empowerment, greater economic opportunities, and active participation in local and global social communities. Ultimately, it is the gateway to lifelong learning.

Inclusion: We ensure that our fluency scheme is inclusive, catering to diverse learners, cultures, and backgrounds, providing texts that represent different perspectives and experiences to foster empathy and understanding. We have also aligned our scheme to foundation subjects to create a golden thread of knowledge and vocabulary throughout.

Impact: Our resources are designed for whole-class teaching, so that all children are given the chance to fully develop their reading fluency in all areas. This includes pace, accuracy and prosody. Pilot studies have made use of assessments that show significant improvements in accuracy, reading rate and prosody over the school year.



Our mission is to ensure that schools have the tools and skills needed to teach reading fluency consistently from Year 2 to Year 6. We want all children to access engaging and progressively more challenging texts as they make their way through school, reaching their potential as readers who read accurately, at the correct rate with expression.

The Fluency Factory Story

The Problem: Around nine million adults in the UK are still functionally illiterate, and one in four British five-year-olds struggle with basic vocabulary. Three-quarters of white working-class boys fail to achieve the government's benchmark at the age of 16.

75% of children passed the phonics screening check in 2023 and 72% passed the Key Stage 2 Reading SATs. Thousands of children continue to leave primary schools without the necessary tools to thrive in secondary school. If we look at who these children are, the same problems are seen as in the past: reading is highly dependent on wealth, location, gender and ethnicity.

Many factors are at play here: the rise of digital distractions, decline of libraries and reading cultures, lack of investment in education, poverty and inequality, language barriers and parental education/support.

The Fluency Factory: Founders, Matthew Dix and Headteacher D.M. Crosby, along with teachers across Nottinghamshire, have created resources that are accessible and engaging. By launching The Fluency Factory, a new generation of fluent and expressive readers has been made. It has removed the burden placed on teachers to create high-quality resources from scratch and provided ways a school can ensure the effective teaching of reading fluency with engaging, precisely levelled texts. Several pilot schools have had significant improvements in reading outcomes, including in words correct per minute. So far, there has been an average of 33 words per minute gained per child over 12 weeks.

1979 - 'Methods of Repeated Reading' is published by Dr J. Samuels. His research suggested that fluency was a bridge between decoding and comprehension.

1998 - Labour introduce phonics in the National Literacy Strategy with Letters and Sounds arriving in 2007.

2003 - Tim Rasinski, PhD, writes 'The Fluent Reader' where he highlights the importance of repeated reading, performance reading, and the use of levelled texts.

2012 - The EFF Toolkit recognises the importance of reading fluency intervention, including guided oral reading and repeated reading.

2024 - The Fluency Factory scheme gives schools the tools and skills to bridge comprehension and phonics by creating a consistent and strategic method of teaching fluency through the use of levelled texts.

The Fluency Factory Programme

The Fluency Factory provides a set of resources for each week of the school year. These are levelled texts which become progressively more challenging from the start of Year 2 to the end of Year 6.

Primary schools access digital resources that contain background knowledge, vocabulary exploration, instructions for delivery, the extract itself and an end of week assessment. Phonics Support Cards and Challenge Cards are also provided each week to support children in reaching their potential.

Lessons have a consistent format and work on a cycle of fiction, non-fiction and poetry extracts. They range from archaic texts to modern novels. We have partnered with Bonnier Books to provide some texts and we aim to continue to diversify and increase our collections as we move from Version 1.

The lessons are designed to be delivered by teachers, teaching assistants or supply staff. See examples below and download free samples from our site. Training in-person or online may available on request.

How it Works

- 1.) Schools sign up and download the resources via the website via a single-use login.
- 2.) Staff teach one text per week for 10/15 minutes per day using the PPT, Phonics Support Cards and Challenge Cards in class.
- 3.) Assessment materials are downloaded and administered termly, along with intervention packs as required.
- 4.) Schools who sign up have access for one year to all resources and CPD materials.

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Year 3 - Autumn

In this 12-week block, children read a range of fiction, non-fiction and poetry. Each lesson lasts for 5 days and should take approximately 15 min per day. Texts are within the range of 425L - 550L. Texts which are TBC are within the range but are awaiting a confirmed Lexile® measure. Poetry cannot have a Lexile® measure attributed to it and is therefore age/stage appropriate.



Implementation

Case Study 2: St Swithun's C of E Primary School, Retford

Implementation

We have been using Fluency Factory Reading resources for two terms consistently now. This resource is delivered to a whole class, every day. Each week the children are introduced to a new text and this is then revisited each day throughout that week. We have built this session into our routine following our Collective Worships and the children have fully embraced the consistent routine of the Fluency Factory resource. At the beginning of the week the children are provided with a synopsis of a text, introduced to the author and the year it was published. During that same session we explore four new key words, which the children have been making connections with throughout the week and longer since – they are then read the text for the first time.

The sessions that follow this are set up to support the children building their intonation, expression and fluency by revisiting the text. We have also implemented a recording session following this to support assessments and progress tracking – followed by a comprehension assessment.

Impact

Our children are always very eager to discover what the new text is and what our new focus words mean! They enjoy placing the new published date on our timeline, building the chronology of the texts and using this to understand why certain vocabulary may have been used. The text types and authors have been carefully selected to cover a huge range of time periods, historical events and popular stories which the children are now able to make connections between. The enthusiasm this resource has brought to reading is indescribable – the children look forward to these sessions each day and often remind me of which session it will be before we have started! We have seen a marked difference in the fluency of our children, broadening their vocabulary so much that it has been used in their writing. I can't thank you enough for creating such an outstanding resource, it gives our school incredible continuity with reading in Key Stage 2 following a phonics scheme.

Delivery to the whole class saves time on planning and is able to capture the responses of all abilities within each session maximizing the impact. I am very much looking forward to seeing these resources continue to support our children in years to come!

Implementation


We have been using Fluency Factory for 2 terms. The format is straightforward, clear and easy to use — what you might call professionally 'off-the-peg', just what the busy teacher needs to ensure the sessions are delivered consistently and robustly. It means the children know what to expect each week and lesson by lesson from whichever staff member is delivering. This is especially relevant in the Year 3 job share.

The daily sessions end our mornings and, not only contribute to our reading fluency teaching, but provide an opportunity for oracy through discussion of new vocabulary, concepts or knowledge. The sessions provide challenge for those already fluent through inference and nuances of meaning whilst 'levelling the playing field' for our reluctant or struggling readers through the undaunting range of extracts modelled and revisited until they feel confident.

Impact

The children love the format which supports explicit teaching and learning of vocabulary, reduced cognitive load and retrieval whilst creating a real sense of success by the end of the week for their favourite session – the performance! The variety of texts retains their interest and ensures there is something for everyone.

Fluency Factory is now an embedded part of our fluency teaching which has seen impressive improvements in fluency rates and is a welcome readily accessible resource which has also supported acquisition of additional skills in guided reading sessions, summarising and dictating tasks. An added bonus has been our Fluency Factory classroom display which serves as a retrieval tool for all of the fantastic language enrichment this resource provides.
